## Short description of the event's purpose:

The exchange Aachen - St. Petersburg is a kind of recruitment event of our LC to attract new people and make them acquainted with EESTEC. It is a traditional event that has taken place for a couple of years now. A group of around 10 to 15 Aacheners goes to St. Peters-



burg for two weeks (usually in May), and some time later (usually in July) the Russian group visits Aachen for the same time. The main aspects of that exchange are to get to know the foreign country and culture, find new friends and of course have lots of fun. The following report has been written by one of our

Russian guests about her stay in Germany.

## Memories on the trip to Germany

The feeling is difficult to describe: You are at your parents', in your home country, you understand very well what everybody is talking about and everything seems to be as usual – and only a few hours later all of a sudden you have to remember all those forgotten German words to explain to the border official why you want to travel to Germany. A strenuous and exciting day - but your effort will be rewarded later...

Wednesday, 7th July - This day our unforgettable trip to Aachen began, and just this time I saw a German officer, a kind young man like almost all Germans I should get to know this summer.

On Thursday a visit to the town hall of Aachen was on our programme. After the reception we did a lot of sightseeing to become better acquainted with this town. We all got some nice impressions of this wonderful place with so many students and bicycles. Unfortunately the weather was not so fine, but of course this could not prevent us from having a pleasant evening.

The next daytrip took us to Maastricht in the Netherlands. As for me the labyrinth was the main attraction. There is nothing comparable in Russia. Later we had the opportunity to go shopping. Maastricht is so close to Aachen and Germany, but it is like the difference between black and white. Quite different clothing, a different language, different people and coffee shops wherever you look. However the actual idea of the Netherlands should be withheld from us until we visited Amsterdam, but I will save that story for later.

Have you seen "Kölner Lichter" yet? In case you have not you must absolutely come to Cologne in July. This was really an amazing experience! A two-storey firework accompanied by music - lasting half an hour. It was very crowded, everybody was drinking beer, singing, eating sausages and right on the other side of the bank of the



River Rhine Cologne Cathedral was shining. Wonderful! What else can you expect from a trip to Germany? Apparently nothing, but...

...on Sunday we enjoyed relaxing at the lake shore of the "Rursee" in glorious sun-

shine, watching sailing-boats. The hair was wet from swimming and there was a smell of barbecue in the air - a wonderful moment to dream of the next excursions to Amsterdam and Paris which should take place soon. I want to emphasize that it was particularly interesting to visit such places like the "Rursee". There you can spend some time in nature and sleep in tents. The kitchen, the showers, the bedrooms (if you don't like sleeping outside), the café offering delicious ice-cream and the volleyball field. This kind of relaxing is absolutely uncommon in Russia.

Eventually we went to Amsterdam, the capital of the Netherlands, and did as much as you can do in one day. There was a guided boat trip on the channels. Luckily the weather was fine. Now I know why Amsterdam is the model which St. Petersburg was designed on. The sea air is similar and you can even find the museum "Hermitage" as in St. Petersburg. Van Gogh museum was particularly impressive to me, although many of us obviously preferred the sex museum. As you see our programme was so varied that nobody could be bored. In the evening we had some spare time, which we spend in the red light district. At that time I was already very tired because of those many strange people. They looked completely different from Germans or Russians, and they behaved differently. I did not know what would happen next that evening. All in all it was a very eventful day.

However, I got much more enthusiastic about Paris. I consider it an excellent idea to let everybody of us discover this metropolis on our own or in little groups. First we visited the main sights and afterwards some of us went to Disneyland, others preferred just walking in the city or even relaxing in a park. What did I like best in Paris? That's really a difficult question – perhaps Eiffel Tower, the Louvre or this amazing underground system with uncountable lines. I was fascinated by the fact that the farther you go away from the city centre by metro the less Europeans you will find. Finally I think if one day is enough to get a rough idea of Amsterdam, for Paris it is definitely not! In my opinion it requires at least one week to get an appropriate

impression of this overwhelming and thrilling City of Love!

Some other daytrips took us to Bonn, Düsseldorf, Monschau, Nideggen and Oberhausen, so our journey was indeed full of variety. You cannot picture a foreign country, its people, its architecture and fashion, the way people talk or how varied that country is without having visited various places. For us Russian students it was particularly interesting to get to know these German students, to get an idea of their everyday life, how they feel, where they live and what they eat, what they like doing during their spare time and how they study. All these are important experiences of this journey! I think the German students who participated in this exchange had just as much fun as we had and this was the reason why it was such a fantastic success.

## Short description of the event's purpose:



## Short description of the event's purpose:

Formally, Elektrijada is a competition in knowledge and sports for students of electrical engineering. It's focused mainly on faculty teams from countries of the region, but from this year, it's also open for faculties from all other countries. There are competitions in math, basics of electrical engineering, circuit theory, all kinds of electronics, programming, English, etc. Also there are sports like basketball, handball, football, volleyball (and all other sports that end with ball in their name:), chess, dancing, etc...



On the other hand, Elektri-

jada is not just about competition. In fact, there are more students there that do not compete, than there are those who compete. They come here to cheer for their teams, or just for having fun. And there are a lot of ways to have it, as you will read later...

Every year Elektrijada is held in another place. Last year it was at seaside in Montenegro, and this year it was at mountain Kopaonik, in Serbia. Next year... who knows!?

## Short history of the event:

LC Belgrade organized an exchange during Elektrijada. Participants had a chance to taste the atmosphere that only one thousand students at one place can make. But, what is Elektrijada?

Our exchange begun two days before Elektrijada did. First day was arrival day, and a welcome party. The party was just an intro for parties that we will experience on the mountain. Next was a city rally, a rainy city rally, because it was raining all day long. :) Our guests had a chance to get to know Belgrade, even though it was raining. To compensate that, we organized a dinner on a boat looking at the confluence of rivers Sava and Danube.

Real thing starts from day three, departure for the mountains! Although, there were six guys from Munich with us for the first two days, they didn't travel and sleep in the same place as we did, because they had their own transportation and logging arrangements (as they were officially a



team of TU Munich. Journey was pictorial. From the bus windows one could see much of a Serbian colorful country side. After six hour drive we got to Kopaonik, unpacked our bags, took a little look of surroundings, and started preparing for the first party.

Beside our guests, many LC-s also came to Elektrijada: Banja Luka, Bucharest, Budapest, Cosenza, Craiova, Delft, East Sarajevo, Koper, Ljubljana, Madrid, Munich, Nis, Novi Sad, Podgorica, Rijeka, Skoplje, Sofia, Zurich. It was decided that some kind of Eestec party should be organized every night at the same place (beside that there were about four to five places more where parties were organized and where you could have a good time if you wanted).

Following morning, after whole night partying, we woke up, and while preparing for some hiking experience, we had a small karaoke party. When that was finished we headed for the Marko's rocks, a group of rocks 20 meters high, on which we climbed and took some pictures. While going there you could see a lot of flowers that can

There are, also, some archeological excavations of some, over one hundred years old, church.

Lunch was planed at "Rtanj", a mountain house for students of technical faculties and those who feel like one:). Meat again, prepared the way we like it here in Serbia. After that, one could stay at Rtanj, and enjoy its atmosphere or could head for the hotels and sport courts where rest of the action was going on. You could enjoy martial arts presentation, or a party in the open, and then the night party on the same place as usual. But that's night after-party was a special treat, everybody gone wild.

Next day was free, only event we planed was 'International evening'. Some of us watched sport semifinals, others were trying to catch some sun, and the rest of the crew was somewhere around. Then, with the dusk begun preparations

Now it was up to our participants to present their countries by cooking something traditional, or sharing some of their products with us (food, wine, etc.), or by telling stories and singing songs from their country. We all knew that this is our last night together, and, in the same time, were both happy and sad. Happy because of nice time we spent together and sad because it had to be over now. After our farewell we went to official Elektrijada closing ceremony, where medals were handed, and continued with the party in the open until the down. New day came, and we had to pack our bags and get into the bus for home.

I hope that next year it would be more people on Elektrijada, not necessarily competing, but sharing its spirit. Nevertheless, a lot of our participants competed in various disciplines, at list, a half of them. Munich team even won a first place in competition in English language.

Thing with Elektrijada, and it's success over the years (over 40

years so far) is that it isn't just a competition in knowledge and sports, it's also an competition in good spirit and fun. It's about sharing some of our thoughts and joy with others who fell same way as we do.

So, if you recognized yourselves in this, or are just curious about it, don't hesitate to feel that one in a lifetime experience, to enjoy various kinds of fun, to see a lot of new and crazy people, come here!

But we also wanted to introduce our participants the practical part, so we asked professionals to present practical knowl-







## Short description of the LC:

## Short history of the LC:

LC Helsinki has one of the longest histories of all local committees in EESTEC. It goes back to 1985, when the student union of Helsinki University of Technology invited students of technology from all over Europe to take part in an event called 'Otaniemi October Occasion' at the university campus, Otaniemi. The event was a good opportunity for Dutch and Finnish students to discuss their idea of establishing a European Electrical Engineering students' Cooperation body. As a result of that EESTEC was officially established in the Netherlands the following spring.

According to the old and dusty history books and International Bureau's archives, LC Helsinki was in the beginning referred as "Otaniemi", because of the location of the campus, but as all EESTEC members changed from Natcoms (National Committee) into LCs (Local Committee), Otaniemi first became LC Espoo and eventually LC Helsinki. The home base of LC Helsinki has however never changed but has always remained in Otaniemi under the protective wings of the Guild of Electrical Engineering.

Since the foundation, LC Helsinki has had its ups and downs but succeeded to remain its status as one of the most stable LCs. During these years Helsinki has been represented in the international board 5 times; with Mervi "Memmu "Honkanen 1996, Harri "Hapo" Mansikkamäki 1998, Iikka Väkiparta 1999, Marina Leusko 2001 and Emmi Rautkylä 2004.

# Description of the event's purpose:

The idea of organizing a workshop in Helsinki was raised already in 2004, probably between the 3rd and the 4th glass of wine in the EESTEC Congress in Belgrade. Outi, Aki and Emmi had

heard a lot of a weird professional event called Workshop but never taken part in any. Funny, as nobody in LC Helsinki had! The last Workshop in Helsinki had been back in 1996 or something, so naturally there was no experience of organizing one in our lines anymore. But brave (or crazy) as we are, we decided to compensate the experience with ambition and start sticking the LC with the idea of a WS.

In practise, the Big Project was kicked off in spring 2005. We decided to organize the workshop together with the Guild of Electrical Engineering, which is basically the thing that organizes all study and party related things for telecom, electrical engineering and nowadays also bioinformatics students. Cooperation partners (avoiding the word sponsor!) were Ensto, Schneider Electric, TeliaSonera, Elisa, Microsoft, KONE, YIT, VTT, from which the two first ones represent building technology solutions, two next ones are phone network operators, KONE makes escalators and elevators, YIT is building investor and VTT research institute. It didn't matter that some companies represented the same kind of business branch, because one participant only got to visit half of the companies.

Also our Department of Electrical Engineering was pulled to join the project, and that led to an idea, that the Workshop could actually be arranged as a course, so that Finnish students could also take part in it and earn study credits with it. At the end in the Workshop there were 20 places for Finnish students with the possibility to include it in their studies and another 20 places for motivated EESTECers and the participants were chosen based on their essay with the topic "Living in 2020."

## Short history of the event:

Party time...

The week was planned so that Monday-Friday was more or less dedicated to the workshop and the weekend was for resetting the week and concentrating on bad life and partying. Every night there was a dinner together and some party with a theme such as "Stereotypical Finland" for which we had asked the guests to bring some costumes or other properties, or "Dancing party" with different kinds of dancing related gadgets like dancing mattress or Nintendo eye toy for



kung-fu moves. On Thursday we took our guests to a disco for a student party and on Saturday they had time to explore the centre of Helsinki while doing the City Rally and getting ready for conquering the night club Onnela's dance floor. We also found important to show EESTEcers the famous Finnish

technical student student sitsi-culture (sitsi=fancy dinner party with a

lot of singing, drinking, socializing and making fool of yourself, to make it short) and that's why we took the participants to a cottage, where nobody could disturb our party. Unfortunately there was no lake nor sea by the cottage but sauna maniacs understood to use the snow for cooling down.



#### ... but only after work

The professional part of the week, thus the workshop was planned quite tight and it included a starting session on Monday, company visits on Tuesday and Wednesday from 8 am to 4 pm and group assignment on Thursday and Friday from 8 to 4 or until the assignment was done. For company visits the participants were divided into two groups A and B, both groups with 10 EESTECers and 10 Finnish students and groups assignments were done in a 4-5 person groups divided so, that each group would have both Finns and foreigners and at least one from group A and B. The task of the group assignment and also the goal of the Workshop was to create new concepts concerning Smart House technology. In practice, the participants would use the knowledge they have, based on their studies and the info they had gained during the company visits and write a report about their top 3 ideas. After the Workshop week Finnish student still had couple of days time to polish up the report and ideas and finish the report so that it could be handed-out as Smart House- course paper.

#### Sticks and roses

All in all, the organizers were pretty happy to be able to pull through first of all a course for 40 students and together with that an exchange for 20 EESTECers. Not everything worked as it was planned, and things like horrible accommodation and partly lack of money, time and organizers gave time to both , the organizing team and to the participants ,time to grey hair. From the EESTEC point of

view it was great to get so many nationalities to visit us and to fill our stomachs with weird liquor tastes, when in contrary from the professional point of you it was very disappointing and sad to see EESTECers disrespect to the Workshop by arriving after the WS had already officially started, not appearing to the company visits and not taking part in the group assignment. But at the end we were positively surprised to get more than 20 applications from EESTECers to take part in our event, all though it had been in the air that workshops are lacking the participants due to many overlapping events. But this was only our first try, so be prepared for our next better and mind-blowing Workshop!

## Short description of the LC:

LC Ljubljana has at the moment 63 active members. Yearly we organizing 5 – 6 events, 3 of them are annual workshops. This year we also attend to organize six events. Meetings are held weekly (once a week) in the residence of Student organization of Ljubljana university. We trying to cooperate and to make new projects with other related student organizations (Best, Iaeste, Aegee...). We are also trying to promote EESTEC among students in Ljubljana, especially at university of electrical engineering, computer science, mathematic science... Our relation with professors are getting better and better. Before every WS we invited couple of professors or assistants to the weekly meeting to represent them our ideas about project and to ask if they have some suggestions about it.

## Short history of the LC:

LC Ljubljana exists since the very first establishment of the organization, that was in 1986. Since then LC Ljubljana was very active doing all kinds of events, even Congress in 1999 was no exception. During 90's LC Ljubljana had approximately around 10-20 members, but at start of 2000, number of new members get raised. Reason for that was bigger events with larger number of participants. Main "guil-

ties" for Ljubljana's success are "x" and current presidents: Andrej Prohinar (Proh), Borut Čeh (crazy Borut) and last but certainly not least Vladimir Milošević.

The year 2005 was another step forward for LC Ljubljana. We continued to get new members, and we organized more events than ever! We started with a small event in March for Slovenian students about robotics (this showed us how much of an interest the robotics laboratories at our faculty had for eestec) to which we invited 6 members from LC Rijeka. Then, in April, we had our telecommunications workshop, Next Generation Networks (NGN) 2005, where we hosted 25 participants. #### "FUTURE IS DEVELOPED TODAY"

## Short description of the event's purpose:

Like in the previous years, in 2005, we organized a telecommunication workshop, NGN – New generation networks, this time with the topic" Future is developed today 2005". The whole workshop was divided in two parts, first part being between 12. 4. and 16. 4. 2005 for local students and second part between 16. 4. and 24. 4. 2005 for foreign students. To sum up, there were 24 participants from 9 countries, i.e. from 24 LCs.

The spring international telecommunication workshop has already become traditional; this was the fourth time as we organized it with the cooperation of Laboratory For Telecommunications. Nevertheless, we make a step forward each time, regarding organization and technical part of the workshop. We managed to arrange a variety of interesting lectures at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering.

Apart from social activities, the emphasis was also on a workshop where the participants themselves had to develop some fiction services and, while doing that, had to consider various factors, such as consumers' needs, expanses regarding development, realization, maintenance, marketing; which technologies would be needed, financial structure etc

## Short history of the event:

Later in the evening, at the participants' arrival, we went on a two-day trip to "Mozirska koča". Organizers tried to break the tension between the participants as soon as possible with different activities,

games and later, of course, with the opening of the LC-Ljubljana EESTEC partiesJ.

The week started with a visit to the Dean of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and sightseeing of Ljubljana's well-known attractions (Tromostovje, Ljubljana castle, Parliament, Prešeren statue...), followed by singing on the streets. Next two days were reserved for lectures about ICT challenges in EU, which were warmly welcomed by the participants. I almost forgot that every night was heavily spiced with EESTEC Ljubljana parties in different student clubs across Ljubljana. Nobody will forget the "foam party" at Tramontana club, where we all danced in swim suites (some even without them, wearing just towels). Next day we took a ride with a riverboat several kilometers out of Ljubljana. The funny part was that we ate way too much, therefore some people were concerned about the stability of the boat.

At the end of the week we spent the last two days in Kranjska gora, a famous ski resort, where we partied like it is supposed to, especially because the event was coming to its end. That was the last alcoholic day which ended with a" little" injury of the organizer Mile.

ABOUT THE LECTURES AND PRACTICE: (Lectured by: dipl.ing. Dragan Savić)

Current technologies provide numerous amounts of new products and services. Despite that fact there is a big lack of services that people can really use. Therefore the goal of the workshop participants was to develop projects that all fit into a common topic "ICT challenges in EU" by combining each others ideas, creativity and inventiveness. The participants were divided into five groups with five students per group. Each group made decisions by them selves – which project topic to choose and how it should be developed. It was required to follow the main idea of how to use existent technologies in new ways that would be potentially interesting for international population. That means that they had to discover market niches in which it could be possible to achieve big success with relatively low investments. In other words, they had to find such a market niche for

which they might increase its added value by using Information and Communication Technologies. Is that tourism, education, sales, health-care, etc.? Since technology does not solve problems by itself they had to find out what kind of contents should be offered to cover the legacy or newly created needs issued by users. Facts like costs of services providers, how much is an individual person prepared to pay for using services and how big is the potential market, had to be considered. Moreover services which are not technically demanding can live up to expectations, for example Short Message Service in mobile networks.

From the technical point of view they had to think about implementation possibilities, user and provider safety, costs of infrastructure, costs of data transmission and processing, price of user terminals and especially ease of use of services and terminals for potential end users.

Beside economic (business plan) and technical characteristics of a project it was necessary to consider about the promotion and development of a new product or service. For example: user target group, development of commercial campaign, what type of charging of new services will be introduced, etc.

The last activity of each group resulted in preparing the final presentation where all the important conclusions had to be pointed out. The presentation was limited up to 10 minutes. Those who did not succeed to finish on time were not able to continue due to the time limit constrains of the workshop. During the presentation all the technological, economical and promotional aspects had to be clearly introduced. These facts were taken under the consideration of the final jury which had difficulties to choose the best presentation since all of them were prepared very good. Nevertheless we have chosen the winning group whose project was under the title "News Organizer". Other project titles were: "City SPY", "How to find a job?", "Mobile User Location Information Service" and "Your intelligent travel mate".

My opinion of the workshop as a moderator is that students were really focused on the project work and have clearly showed their skills developed during several years of their studies.

In conclusion, we hope that the spring workshop will remain a traditional event, which will continue to guide students and to unite education and production activity. We hope you will come again to check out next telecommunication workshop, NGN 2006, and again feel the unforgettable Ljubljana eestec spirit.

## Short description of the event's purpose:

The central topic of the workshop was the importance of intercultural compentence for the modern engineer. With the growing globalisation of business, production and development, engineers will face many cultural challenges in their work environment. Under the tuition of an experienced teacher from the Carl von Linde Akademie (CvLA), a special institute at the TU Munich, the participants studied and identified risks and chances of a multicultural work environment.

We organized this workshop with the help of the CvLA and our main sponsor, Texas Instruments. to the Elektrijada a week before the workshop...

As we expected, the welcome party went on until the next morning. Our plan to have a bavarian breakfast at the student union on sunday morning was perfect. The bavarian breakfast usually takes place at around 11 am and consists of special sausages called "Weißwurst" (means white sausage) and "Brezn"(pretzels). As I left Athens on a sunny May day, I felt a little depressed for not being born Greek and member of their LC, therefore, share the pride for organizing such an extraordinary event, no matter it was

their first (Telecommunication and Networks Workshop, Athens 2005). But, summer passed and fall brought a ray of sunshine for me, as we, members of LC Novi Sad, were the one responsible for the exchange that will long be remembered and talked over and over, as the one of the best organized and one



of the most exciting exchanges in the history of The Organization.

First, the official part: programmable logic controllers and their purpose – control of systems in industry. Participants attended series of practical lectures, where they learnt to program the PLCs using ladder diagrams, and I've heard many nice words from the participants about how this matter proved to be really interesting and how much they could learn in such a short time. It was "worth efforts"; "demanding", "long lasting", but I didn't hear the word "boring". And I think that was what a workshop should look like. Briefly, the participants were informed about the projects that are currently being done at the Department, including Industry automation, projects in geo-informatics (GPS systems, subterranean scans, creation and use of digital maps) and biomedical engineering (virtual biomedical instruments and the application in modern healthcare).



And second, unofficial part, is what really made our workshop special. To get the participants together and get to know them, better sooner than later, we put them in the mountaineers resort, in the wilderness of Frushka gora, a small mountain nearby, as soon as they arrived. Supplied them (and us, of course) with copious

amounts of drinks and meat for barbeque and Paprikash (one who knows what I'm talking about shouldn't read this with empty stomach, if one doesn't want to eat a keyboard). 
One of the attractive places visited was cave Orlovaca.

  - Taste The Networks LC Skopje December 2005
  - Graphics Workshop LC Budapest February 2005

### History:

In summer of 2004, our first CP Orhan was in Ljubljana as a world traveler before going to Brazil. Our first contact with EESTEC was found on those days, he met some EESTECers there and ideas started to appear in his mind. When he came back from Brazil, he was telling many things about EESTEC but Brazil. As our application to EESTEC was on its way to the EESTEC International Board, Orhan and our first chairwoman, Ýrem, participated to the "Network WS" in Budapest in February 2005. Their fascinated and charmed impressions were greeting us when they came back. These impressions spread very fast among us and in few weeks there were 15 people interested about EESTEC. But only idea wasn't enough, we needed to do more official things; like having recognition from our university ITU (Istanbul

Technical University), preparing statute, forming board, designing web site, finding an office, etc. In March Orhan became CP and Yrem became chairwoman. We started our presentations and meetings in our faculty, furthermore we were telling EESTEC everyone we met in the faculty. Even our present CP was kidnapped on her way to home and put inside our car to tell her about EESTEC. We really wanted to participate the EESTEC Congress 2005 but we couldn't participate because of the exams and lack of official recognition by our university, only could manage to make phone calls to Madrid. On those times our first plans about organizing our first event failed due to same reasons. In May, at the end of our Spring semester we were about 20 people however it was also time for graduations and only few members were left in the summer period. During the summer of 2005, our effort went on with few people who are mostly present board members, we tried make our plans more clear, prepared project files of EESTEC Istanbul and Get Mobile WS and also our present chairman, Ömür, started the negotiations with IEEE Student Branch for cooperation. In September, with the beginning of new semester we formed our new board and made the cooperation meeting with IEEE Student Branch Board.

After that meeting, EESTEC Observer Istanbul became a committee of IEEE Student Branch and chairperson of EESTEC Istanbul became board member of IEEE Student Branch. This cooperation helped us to have official recognition and find new members. During September and October, there were presentations of EESTEC every week in the faculty, soon there were around 50 members. Then we could focus on our first WS; meeting every week to make arrangements and preparations for event, trying to find sponsor contacts, designing website, running from one academicians room to another to introduce ourselves clearly.

So on with around 25 active members, our WS was ready to be held from 13th of February to 19th of February with main sponsor TELSIM and 3 other sponsors (Hotel Villa, Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality and Karaköy Güllüoðlu Baklava) helping us to have a budget more than  $20000\,\mbox{\ensuremath{\mathfrak{e}}}$ .

## Future plans:

Our first aim is, of course, becoming a Local Committee in EESTEC Congress 2006 but as our participants of Get Mobile WS could easily realize, this will never be enough for us. We've been one of the most active Observer Committees and we want to be one of the most active LC's, too. We have around 60 members and the number is rising rapidly, besides we want to motivate them more and make almost all our members active.

Until September which means our new semester, we want to organize at least one more WS about Alternative Energy Sources and also a WS with IEEE Student Branch about Engineering Management.

Also summer is getting closer, lectures will be over and it'll be suitable time to enjoy coasts, valleys and nature of Türkiye. We're preparing our project files for two exchanges; one in south coast of Turkey near Antalya and other one in Cappadocia region. We hope to accomplish both of them but one of them will be for sure. We're planning to host around 30 participants to enjoy all these beauties with us. Furthermore we have plans to organize 3 more exchanges with 3 more LC's; we'll visit them and they'll come here as our guests.

After September, in our new semester, we want to organize two more WS that we've already started our plans for it.

Also we want to improve our cooperation with IEEE Student Branch and spread this cooperation to other LC's.

And there are more ideas waiting us for EESTEC.

Academical part of GET MOBILE '06 workshop dealt generally with mobile communication systems, especially with 3G technology. EESTECers have met where continents meet. Approximately 15 of our members organized this event with the cooperation of Istanbul Technical University IEEE Student Branch.

The WS started 2 days before the exact date with an unexpected call in the morning. Bence from Budapest sent a message which said that he would be in Istanbul in the evening. Next day remaining members of the Hungarian crew had showed up, and also a cute couple from Belgrade, they were taken by our travel crew, Nesli, Acan and Murat, like all other participants, so we started partying earlier. That night, hmmm we guess it was almost morning, Ömür found Slovenians making circles around Taksim Square with their car while our treasurer, Onur, was calculating more as usual. The others, except Macedonians, came on 13th then WS started officially with our opening ceremony that took place in Mechanical Engineering Faculty of our Istanbul Technical University. There was a surprise waiting for the participants, one guy playing "ney" (which is an instrument seems like a pipe with a magical sound) featured by a guitarist. Opening ceremony continued with Ömür's (Chairman of Observer Istanbul) and Erdem's (Chairman of ITU IEEE Student Branch) speeches, then some presentations about the event and lecture schedule, in addition to that

some movies about Istanbul and Türkiye. We confess after all that stuff a couple of the participants was sleeping but who can blame them, it was their last chance to sleep. However after drinking some beer in the Welcome Party participants took their revenge with showing their presentations. Like in every Welcome Party, we drank as much as we could and furthermore we danced and enjoyed ourselves like we've been together for a long time. Thanks to our party masters, Emre, Onur and Özgür. Even the DJ left his cabin and started dancing with us at the end of the party, but he had a great company in DJ cabin, "reggae performance of Borut Ceh", shouting that EESTEC Istanbul is not an Observer Committee anymore.



The second day would start with sponsors' presentations and then lectures. So everybody was woken up with a great effort and cruelty. We took everybody to Electrical and Electronics Engineering Faculty of our university which is located in our main campus Ayazaga. The academical part of the WS started with

deputy dean Prof. Doc. Eţref Adalý's speech. Then the advisor of ITU IEEE Student Branch, Asst. Prof. Dr. D. Turgay Altýlar welcomed participants. Ömür left the microphone to Borut to make the speech about EESTEC then took back to talk about EESTEC OBSERVER ISTANBUL. After introduction of sponsors, plaquettes were given to them and lecture of main sponsor "TELSIM" started. In addition to foreigner participants and members of Observer Istanbul, students from our faculty participated to the lectures. The lunch was served in our main refectory. Afternoon, there were lectures from "Nokia" as the partner of "TELSIM" which was about IP Multimedia Subsystem Services and Real Time Video Sharing and from "ZTE" which was about 3G technologies around the world. When the lectures were over everybody were dying to have some rest in the hotel. Open buffet dinners were eaten generally in our four star hotel, Hotel Villa.

After dinner, as a lot of single people, we were ready for the Valentine's Day Party, at that night we saw some blue, lonely Serbian guys from Novi Sad, but in the end they were also having fun. That night we heard that Macedonian crew was totally pissed of because of drinking but we couldn't understand how they sober up and started drinking again, cos the night ended in their room with drinking rakija.

Third day, the lecture from Prof. Dr. Mine Kalkan was cancelled due to the accident her son had and Ömür felt pity for the participants and let them sleep a little more, as we had tired the participants with parties so much. While it was snowing heavily outside, participants had their lunch in Architecture Faculty of our university which has a fascinating architecture style. After lunch, it was time to walk under snow and to visit Dolmabahçe Palace which was built in 1854 as the last palace of Ottoman Empire, where former Turkish president Mustafa Kemal Atatürk lived while he was in Istanbul. After the palace there was a surprise from unbalanced weather of Istanbul, shiny and calm Bosphorus. We passed to Asian Side of Istanbul by boat; everyone was charmed by great view of sunny Bosphorus and Istanbul after snow. Then it was time for passport check, passports were ready but they were only checked by Ömür as a little innocent joke. After touching Asian Land the tram was waiting for us and for our Kadýköy trip with the guidance of Selda, Acan and Nesli. Occupation of tram by EESTECers couldn't survive so long, so we jumped to have a drink in a coffee shop. Participants were about to rest, but they couldn't cos in Çamlýca, the highest hill of Istanbul, a great scene and meal were waiting for them. After having Turkish meals and desserts, we couldn't stand being without alcohol anymore and drove our way to a pub where there was a live performance of a great band. Around 3AM we left Asian Side to go on partying in our room, this time we had vodka instead of rakija.

Last lectures were on fourth day, this was one of the hardest days to wake the participants up so Goran and Sanja from Skopje helped

poor Ekin and Onur for this hard duty. After traffic jam, we were in the conference hall again. Lectures were given by first Huawei about Distribution and Tendency of 3G Market Around the World and Experiences and then from Seimens about UMTS Services and Application Areas. This time Ekin tried to thank the sponsors and lectures but she could only manage to prate due to lack of sleep. Lunch had been served in main refractory again and participants turned back to the hotel, but not for sleeping this time, for having practice after all theoretical lectures. Applications of 3G technology were introduced by Nokia and TELSIM then tried by participants and our members. So intense lectures were over, and it was time for resting and shopping. But it took more time than expected; participants were a little bit late to dinner in our hotel and also for our surprise in the pub. During the week of WS, Jure from Ljubljana and Vesna from East Sarajevo had their birthdays on the same day so it was time to celebrate it with a birthday cake. After feeling alcohol in our veins, we took our way to a disco to dance till morning. When we were tired of dancing we continued drinking in the cute couple's room. As we understood, there

Restful and peaceful atmosphere of that great mosque didn't leave us alone when we leaded to Hipodrom Square of Byzantium Empire where obelisks of Byzantium and Egyptian Empires linger. Although we had showed only ten percent of the historical places in the old city, this amount of history lecture was enough for all of us, furthermore sun was about to set and inviting us to dinner. We added the Turkish Night arranged by Özgür to this great mixture of Ottoman and Byzantium history and culture, which took place on the Galata Bridge constructed over Golden Horn. We couldn't understand whether the weather or participants were hot, dance floor wasn't enough for us and everybody was on the bridge



dancing and enjoying the enthusiastic Golden Horn view. GET MOBILE '06 participants were unstoppable, being fish in the raki bottle wasn't enough for them, so Taksim greeted our full of raki bodies.

Sixth day, in our breakfast, participants seemed to be tired

but there was another surprise, Ömür was not tired yet and he was in an unexpected frisky and playful mood, joking with everybody and motivating them for another long walking day. He took everyone to Istiklal Street where we had walked on many times, talked a lot about the street and places, after sometime Ömür's mood spread to everyone. After presentations of world's second subway (Tünel) and Galata Tower it was time to fill our stomachs up with the best baklava and börek of Türkiye in our sponsor's factory, Karaköy Güllüodlu. Then we were on our way to Spice and Grand Bazaars passing Galata Bridge on foot. People lost their selves in these bazaars and showed great performances about bargaining, most of the things were bought for less than half of the original price. It was time to rest like old Ottomans, smoking water pipe (nargile) in Tophane. Ömür's cheery mood couldn't stay so long, before dinner he was out of energy, but finally he

showed up in farewell party. It was hard to take all the participants to the farewell party place, they were begging Ekin and Onur to sleep a little but who can blame us, we had warned them before coming Istanbul that it was forbidden to sleep. Farewell party was, as usual, enjoyable but bittersweet; we didn't miss the chance to enjoy our last night and danced till 6 AM. There were still many things to do and to talk but time was against us, people were hugging each other and talking about what they had had during the fabulous week. As participants were giving their presents, there was an unbelievable enthusiasm and thankful mood. Each one will be kept as a great memory in our office but for the traditional drinks we don't know how long we may keep their taste in our mouths and alcohol in our veins, we need to meet somewhere in Europe again to test it more.

As ending a week full of great memories seventh day was full of tears, some of them were hidden but generally openly. Ömür was hanging around trying to cheer up everybody, and some other organizers couldn't end the week without being ill and left hotel with a fever in addition to tears. As it was the first event of EESTEC Observer Istanbul, whole week and each participant were so special for us, and we hope they left Istanbul with nice impressions. And thank you everybody for their participance, friendship and precious company.

Another year is around and here we are at the 20th anniversary of our association. EESTEC is 20 yeas old. And still there is much left to learn, do and achieve. In the past 3 years EESTEC has achieved a lot. It has restructured from an organization which had its mainly events exchanges, into an organization with its clearer purpose, colorful range of workshops and number of other events. Pleasure and fun events are a good example of that. Thus this are not official ESTEC events, they are playing a big role in increased EESTEC activity. These kinds of events held usually during the summer, increase the activity

of the EESTECers on the local level in the most »critical« months, when EESTEC was not active in the past.

Also I must say that new coming LCs are on the average level doing far better job than the old ones, this also shows that EESTEC is moving forward with more and more University joining the Association. These are also the LCs implementing the new ideas and initiatives of EESTEC events and activities.

In the last BOM before Congress I was going trough the Congress minutes of the Delft Congress held in the year 2000. What I have noticed is that the board at that time had similar ideas and that until this year they were still not reality

Even more, this year board discussed the same questions and ideas allover again. This lead me to the conclusion that what EESTEC is lacking the most is continuity, this was partly solved with introducing Board Assistants (BA) and writing the full reports of the board members combined with strategy for the future. But this is still not enough. What I would advise to EESTEC is to start thinking of different approach of the board work, such as old board helping the new elected board 6 months after elections, not only with e-mail counseling, but also with real time meetings and suggestions, etc.

EESTEC is growing bigger and bigger every year, this means it will also require more professional approach and more structured, upto date work, which means in the future questions like EESTEC head-quarter, more oriented strategy towards specific companies, EESTEC internships will have to be discussed and adopted.

Nevertheless this year we have done a lot. First time in EESTEC we have been approved to get the EU grant, memorandum of understanding with IEEE was signed again, we have finally achieved the continuity in getting reports from LCs, we have renewed the sponsor approach (but unluckily run out of time to test it and prove it in practice), the bases for the new open source multifunction web page were set, etc.

Currently this is my 6th and last year in EESTEC. When I joined in 1999, everything was different and not as far on the level as we have it today. But still there are many things to be done and to be improved. To the coming generations of EESTECers I would suggest never being satisfied with the current situation, but always try to improve it, adopt it and restructure it as this is the essence of EESTEC development. We are all students! Concerning ideas, we are at the same time most critical and most constructive group of people. With our ideas we are building new economies, new approaches and new societies.

This is what I also wish to all of you who will have the opportunity to lead EESTEC in the following years. Take EESTEC to its borders, further than we can ever imagine today.

In the end I would like to thank very much all my international vice-chairman, Fra, Flo and Tijana and the international treasurer Marina. You have been really great and have helped many times when there was a lot of work and have contributed essentially to a greater EESTEC and team spirit in the EESTEC International board.

Definitely finishing my degree and then working in industry. But before that I will try to stimulate the EESTEC Alumni movement?!!!


# What I gave to EESTEC:
